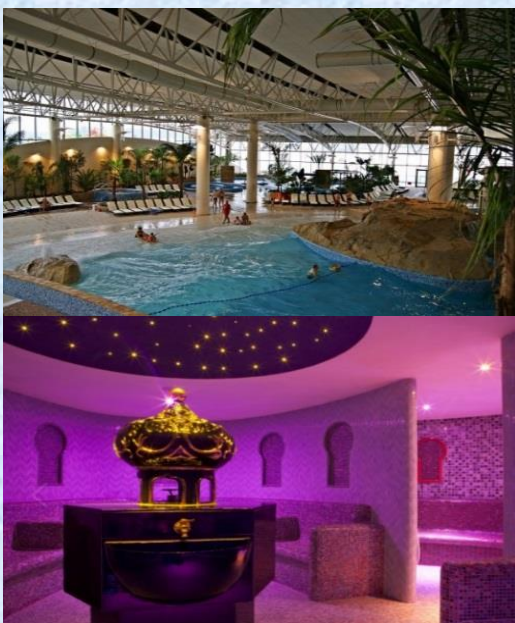




Poznań is a city on the Warta river in west-central Poland. It is best known for its renaissance old town, destroyed during World War II and then rebuilt. Poznań is an important cultural and business centre with many regional customs, traditional Saint Martin's croissants and local dialect. Poznań is one of the biggest cities in Poland, one of the largest Polish centers of trade, industry, sports, education, technology, tourism and culture



Termy Maltańskie is the biggest complex in Poland near the Maltańskie Lake with olympic swimming pool (50m) and short swimming pool (25m) next to. There are 3800 places on tribune, big aquapark and world of sauna and SPA. The hotel Novotel is located very near - 300m from the pool. It takes 10min to get to the city center by car or bus.

In the city centre you can visit many beautiful places, monumental and historical old town. There are a lot of restaurants, pubs and shopping centres.

The characteristic sing of Poznań is a figure of two goats, which appear everyday at 12.00 pm on big clock on town hall. In the old town, at noon, you can hear anthem of Poznań and watch little fight with goats' horns.



The name Poznań probably comes from the polish verb „*poznać*”, which means "to get to know" so simply you should get know this town! You will find entertainment and fun there for sure!
