1. AIM OF THE TRAINING PROGRAM

• This training program aims at refreshing the knowledge of experienced CMAS One-Star Instructors with regards to the basic concepts, principles and instructional techniques, diver education and training, introducing them to the instructional techniques involved in teaching advanced, specialties, rescue and entry-level leadership Diver Training Programs, which will enable them to present these CMAS Diver Training Programs in a safe and competent manner

2. CLASSIFICATION

 The CMAS Two-Star Instructor is considered competent to conduct all CMAS basic Diver training programs i.e. Diver One, Two and Three-Star levels and assist in Instructor courses.

3. INSTRUCTOR AND ASSISTANT REQUIREMENTS

- The CMAS Two-Star Instructor Training Program may be conducted by a minimum of a CMAS Three-Star Instructor in active status that complies with the requirements of CMAS national federations.
- The CMAS Three-Star Instructor may be assisted by a CMAS Two-StarInstructor in active status.

4. COURSE STRUCTURE AND DURATION

► ACADEMICS (ESTIMATED HOURS):75

 See CMAS Two-Starinstructor Syllabus and the national federation Three-Starstaff Instructor Workshop Guidelines.

► PRACTICAL APPLICATION:

 See CMAS two star instructor Syllabus and the national federation Three-Starstaff Instructor Workshop Guidelines.

► THE MINIMUM NUMBER OF OPEN WATER DAYS:

 CMAS allows three-star instructors to schedule the number of days for practical sessions in open water according to the CMAS Two-Star instructor syllabus, number of candidates, their skill level and the diving environment.

5. COMPETENCIES OF A CERTIFIED TWO-STAR INSTRUCTOR

- A CMAS Two-StarInstructor shall be trained such that, when assessed by a CMAS Three-StarInstructor, he shall be deemed to have a professional level of knowledge regarding diving theory, theoretical academics, confined and open water teaching, supervising skills, solid rescue skills, dive management, supervision abilities, exemplary diving skills and sufficient diving experience.
- To teach, assess and certify candidates on all CMAS Diver Training programs, as well as the CMAS Rescue Diver Training Program in accordance with the prescribed CMAS Diver Training Standards on their theoretical knowledge, confined and open water skills.
- To teach, assess and certify candidates on all the CMAS Specialty Diver Training Programs for which he has successfully completed the appropriate CMAS Specialty Diver Training programs and/or Specialty Instructor Training Programs which are allowed to be presented by a CMAS Two-StarInstructor in terms of the relevant CMAS Diver Training Standards on their theoretical knowledge, confined and open water skills and other practical skills.





- To act as an Assistant to a CMAS Three-StarInstructor during the presentation of CMAS One and Two-StarInstructor Training programs.
- The parameters within which the CMAS Two-StarInstructor is qualified to dive are those applicable to additional diver training certifications he already holds.

6. PREREQUISITES FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE TRAINING PROGRAM

- Be at least twenty (20) years of age; there is no upper age limit.
- Shall undergo a diving medical examination by a registered medical practitioner and cleared as suitable for participation in the sport of recreational SCUBA diving in accordance with procedures laid down by the CMAS Federation prior to participating in any in-water activities; and
- Sign the appropriate form(s) as required by the CMAS Federation acknowledging and assuming the risks of SCUBA diving prior to participating in any in-water activities.

7. EXPERIENCE / KNOWLEDGE / CERTIFICATION

- Hold the following CMAS Diver Training certifications:
- Hold CMAS One Star instructor for at least one year.
- CMAS Two-Starinstructor candidate shall have gained teaching experience by taking the role of an instructor in a minimum of 25 training sessions (in the classroom and in confined and open water) which exposed them to a comprehensive range of duties and problems.
- Submit proof that he has assisted a CMAS Three-StarInstructor on at least one (1)
 CMAS One Star Instructor Training Programs.
- Conducting, staffing and evaluating experience gained at Instructor level courses before becoming a CMAS Two-Star Instruct is acceptable.

9. REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTIFICATION

- In order to be certified as a CMAS Two-StarInstructor, The candidate shall:
 - Comply with all the prerequisites for participation in the training program as prescribed in this Standard;
 - Successfully complete the theoretical assessment as provided for in this Standard.
 - Successfully complete the confined water assessment as provided for in this Standard.
 - Successfully complete the open water assessment as provided for in this Standard.
 - Successfully complete the teaching skills assessment as provided for in this Standard; and
 - Successfully complete the emergency procedure skills assessment as provided in this Standard.



10. REQUIRED THEORETICAL KNOWLEDGE AND DIVING SKILLS

- **► SYLLABUS REQUIREMENTS**
- ▶ **ADMINISTRATION:** Candidates should be informed of the administrative obligations and recommendations of the CMAS and national federation Two-StarInstructor Training Program
- ▶ **ADVANCED DIVING KNOWLEDGE**: The candidate shall have a professional level of knowledge of all the theory and the skills prescribed by the relevant CMAS Diver Training Standards.
- ▶ THE THEORY OF LEARNING: The candidate shall have a professional level of knowledge of the theory of training.
- ▶ **GENERAL**: Teaching theory, methods, Microteaching, the learning process, differences in the ways adults and children learn and oral communications must be mastered.
- ▶ **ACADEMICS**: General preparation, lesson objectives, lesson preparation, lesson planning, lesson delivery, training aids, and feedback on candidate performance are information that must be provided to a candidate before or during the first class. Classroom requirements, selection and layout of a classroom and control of candidates in a classroom must be complied with.
- ▶ **EMERGENCY PROCEDURE SKILLS:** The candidate shall demonstrate to the CMAS Instructor his mastery of the emergency procedure skills oxygen administration, diver rescue and rescue management.

11. PRACTICAL TRAINING PARAMETERS

- ► CONFINED WATER SCUBA SKILLS
- The candidate shall, after giving a demonstration of skills to a student, be able to competently demonstrate to a CMAS Instructor CMAS Three-Star Instructor all of the open water skills as prescribed by the CMAS One, Two and Three Star Diver Training Program Standards as well as the CMAS Rescue Diver Training Program Standards in a manner showing the highest level of mastery and competence in the open water environment to a Two-Star Instructor Level.

▶ OPEN WATER SCUBA SKILLS

• The candidate shall, after giving a demonstration of skills to a student, be able to competently demonstrate to a CMAS Three-Star Instructor all of the open water skills as prescribed by the CMAS One, Two and Three Star Diver Training Program Standards as well as the CMAS Rescue Diver Training Program Standard in a manner showing the highest level of mastery and competence in the open water environment to a Two-Star Instructor Level.

12. ASSESSMENT

► KNOWLEDGE

 The candidate shall demonstrate to the CMAS Three-Star Instructor knowledge of SCUBA diving and of SCUBA diver training by taking and passing a written examination.





This examination shall test the following as prescribed in this standard:

- Theoretical knowledge of SCUBA diving.
- Level of knowledge of SCUBA skills.
- Level of knowledge of SCUBA diver training.
- Level of knowledge of emergency procedures (first aid and CPR, oxygen administration, diver rescue and rescue management).
- Competency in course management and quality control.

► CONFINED WATER SCUBA SKILLS

• The candidate shall demonstrate to the CMAS Three-StarInstructor his ability to assess different levels of divers in their ability to carry out skills in confined water.

▶ OPEN WATER SCUBA SKILLS

- The candidate shall demonstrate to the CMAS Three-StarInstructor his ability to assess different levels of divers in carrying out skills during their open water examination dives.
- Demonstrate their ability to instruct a group of students in selected diving techniques in confined and open water as defined by the national federation.
- Demonstrate familiarity with the contents of the one, two and Three-StarDiver courses and the ability to teach a group of students in a classroom, confined and in the open water.
- The candidate shall demonstrate to the CMAS Three-StarInstructor his mastery
 of the teaching skills by playing the role of an instructor in a structured series of
 actual or simulated training sessions (both in the classroom and in the confined
 and open water environments) which simulate the duties that he will be expected
 to fulfil once qualified.

► TEACHING SKILLS

- The candidate shall demonstrate to a CMAS Three-StarInstructor the skills of lesson preparation, planning and delivery of at least two (2) lectures on any of the subject areas or a part of a subject area prescribed in the following CMAS Diver Training Standards:
 - CMAS Two-StarDiver Training Program
 - CMAS Rescue Diver Training Program
 - CMAS Three-StarDiver Training Program, and
 - CMAS Instructor Training Standards: CMAS One Star Instructor Training Program

▶ EMERGENCY PROCEDURE SKILLS

The candidate shall demonstrate to the CMAS Three-StarInstructor his mastery
of the emergency procedure skills first aid skills, oxygen administration skills as
prescribed in the Standard during one or more simulated rescue exercises.

13. CERTIFICATION

 Upon successful completion of the training program The candidate shall be awarded with a CMAS Two-StarInstructor C-card.
