Organisation of Elimination Races

In force as from January 1st 2023

(BoD222 - November 26th 2022)

1. **DESCRIPTION**

The competition area consists of a pontoon of a 25 m width (which can accommodate up to 8 swimmers) and a line of buoys situated at 75±5 m and parallel to the pontoon. The buoys must have alternating colours for instance yellow and red.

The swimmers start in the water keeping touch with the pontoon up to the start signal

The starting procedure is the following: the Judge announces 1 minute, 30 seconds and then, at the end of the minute, he issues the command "take your marks", whereupon the swimmers start in the water keeping their hand in touch with the pontoon up to the start signal. Once they are stationary, the starting signal is given.

The athletes swim to the buoys where they turn letting the buoy at their left and come back to the pontoon where they must touch the electronic pad. Each swimmer must turn at the buoy that corresponds to him. If they do not they are disqualified. (The flag at the swimmer's snorkel must be in the same colour as the buoy at which he must turn). The swimmers swim several successive rounds (not more than 4). At the end of each round a number of swimmers which arrive at the last positions are eliminated. There is a time of rest of 1 minute (after the arrival of the last swimmer) at each round. In the case of the relays, the swimmer receiving the relay must keep contact with the pontoon up to the moment of the touch by the swimmer passing the relay.

If a participant has already been qualified for a position that leads to a medal, he does not lose it in case of elimination or disqualification.


In the case of a final with 4, a participant eliminated in the 2nd round wins the bronze medal. A participant disqualified in the 3rd round wins the silver medal.

In the case of a final with 5, a participant disqualified in the 3rd round wins the bronze medal. If two participants are disqualified, both win a bronze medal.

In the case of a final with 6, a participant disqualified in the 4th round wins the bronze medal. If two participants are disqualified, both win a bronze medal.


Any participant disqualified in a final round involving 4 teams/swimmers (final with 7 or 8) does not have a right to a medal.

The competition can be organised only if there are 4 or more swimmers/teams. If there are up to 8 participants they can go directly to the final. The precise structure of the final rounds is given below.



2. FINALS

2.1. HEATS UP TO 8 PARTICIPANTS



When there are more than 8 participants it is necessary to organize qualifying heats. At the end of the heats 8 swimmers are qualified for the final.



2.2. HEATS FROM 9 TO 16 PARTICIPANTS



The final is swam with 8 swimmers: 4 swimmers are qualified from each heat.


When there are exactly 9 participants, 4 swimmer go directly to the final and the 5 others swim once, the last one is eliminated and the remaining 4 go to the final.






2.3. HEATS FROM 17 TO 32 PARTICIPANTS

We organise 4 heats and qualify 2 from each heat so that the final is swam with 8 participants.


